Property damage was enormous although no over-all estimate was available. The storms, with wind up to 100 miles an hour, lashed over 2,500 miles across the United States yesterday after sweeping up through the United States from Texas. In many southern Ontario areas, the blow was described as the worst within living memory. Damage was heaviest in the Windsor and London regions. One provincial police official said the damage around Windsor alone could run "anywhere from a half million to a million dollars." The storm dumped six inches of snow on Montreal. Snow also blocked traffic in other cities, including Ottawa and Quebec.

Wintry Spring Weather Goes Into Florida

(By the Associated Press.)
Violent early spring weather, much of it wintry, struck along the Eastern seaboard, leaving the eastern half of the nation very damp. Property damage was estimated in the millions of dollars. The stormy weather was blamed for at least 28 deaths. Travel was slowed, both on the highway and in the air. Power service was disrupted. Blizzards whipped across mid-continent areas. Rain, sleet and strong winds buffeted large areas of the Eastern seaboard, leaving down buildings. Floods harassed some parts of the South. A tornado struck in a village area of Northern Ohio, injuring four people.
