## Ging Gangs Up On Video Brass

Actor Jack Ging is not a big man by Hollywood standards. He is 5 feet 11 and weighs 160. However, when it comes to expressing what he thinks about certain aspects of television and his career to date in the medium, he is in the "10-foot-tall" league.

This makes Jack, co-star of NBC-TV's "The Eleventh Hour," a puzzle to most TV officials, who are used to almost complete docility from its young actors. It almost makes Jack a frequently happy, purposeful man in a profession noted for the insecurity of its members.

"I have been accused of being outspoken, of fighting with the brass, of saying what I think," said Ging during a recent visit to New York. "It's true. I firmly feel you have to take a definite stand on what you believe in. In so doing you may make a mistake. I have made my share of them and when I realized that I had, I tried to overcome them."

"But bear this in mind—show me a man who doesn't make mistakes and I'll show you a man who isn't living. Fence straddling is existing—not living."

"I'VE LEARNED," continued Jack, "that the truth will never hurt you. It may cause some problems at the time you express it, but in the long run it generally works out to your advantage."

The slender, 31-year-old actor was thinking possibly of own experience of a few seasons back. At that time he had a running role in the western series "Wells Fargo." In the trade, he was thought of as lucky guy on the way up. But Jack felt differently.

As the series continued, he became more dissatisfied with it. Finally, it was reported, he received a script which he thought was particularly poor. He announced that he was sick and ashamed of his role, tore up the script and walked out on the show.

"I couldn't work in TV for a year," said Jack. "I couldn't even collect unemployment insurance since I had left my job voluntarily. It was rough for a while. Fortunately, my wife and I don't live very high. We just need a nice, clean place to live in and enough money to eat properly."

A MAN of great determination, Ging has accomplished most of the things he set out to do so far. A native of Alva, Okla., he made his high school football team despite the fact that he weighed but 145 pounds. When he was only 10 pounds heavier, he was a first-string back on the University of Oklahoma team for three straight years.

After graduation, Ging played pro football for a while and then joined the Marines. While in service, he decided that he wanted to be an actor. He was encouraged by his wife, Gretchen, who he had married in 1956. Upon his discharge in 1957, they headed west.

In Hollywood, Jack got a small part in a play. This led to a running role in "MacKenzie's Raiders." In addition, he has played roles in other TV series before taking on his present job on "The Eleventh Hour" as Dr. Paul Graham.
